Safeguarding Data

- 887 safeguarding concerns received in Q3, 2289 YTD
- 343 concerns about people in their own homes (Q3). 931 cases YTD
- 387 concerns about adults in care home (Q3), 934 YTD
- 160 Neglect cases identified in Q3/339 YTD
- 97 Physical abuse cases in Q3/164 YTD
- 18 referrals from Community Nurses, District Nurses or CHC staff. 6 referrals from GPs in the year
- 43 referrals from self, relative/friend or unpaid carer in Q3/99 YTD
- Risk removed or reduced in 64 cases and 1 case risk remains in Q3

Raising a safeguarding concern- Principles

- Seek consent from the adult to share the concern with Adult Social Care

 if they are able to give this and ask them what they think would help
 stop the harm/abuse (Outcomes)
- If they are unable to give consent, complete a capacity assessment/ best interest decision and send into ASC if in their best interest
- Consent is NOT required if
 - The Adult is being harmed by a Person in Position of Trust (PIPOT) worker or volunteer
 - The adult is under duress/victim of coercive control
 - The adult is at serious risk of harm/death as a result of self neglect and/or hoarding

Was Not Brought

- Two Safeguarding Adults Reviews completed into Lola and Gillian , both were subject to neglect (Wilful Neglect) by family members
- Both adults had a learning disability diagnosis and were on the LD register. However they did not attend annual reviews. Gillian had not been brought to other health appointments – cervical screening, flu/covid vaccinations etc.
- As a result we have agreed a **Was Not Brought Policy** for adults with LD, however it could be applied to other adults that rely on family members to bring them to appointments (Dementia, mental ill health etc)
- All Primary Care staff are asked to record WNB not DNA and to make contact with family to explore why appointment was not kept.
- If this does not result in a new appointment/attendance to raise a safeguarding concern
