Who do we vaccinate?

- School years Reception to Year 11
- Schooling in Barnsley
- Home Educated
- Not in Education including gypsy travellers, asylum seekers.

Vaccine	Year groups	When?
Childhood Flu (Nasal and IM)	Reception to Year 9 (4 – 11 years) Up to 18 years (Special schools)	September - January
HPV	Year 8 (1 st Dose) Year 9 (2 nd Dose)	January - August
Td/IPV and Men ACWY	Year 9	March – August
MMR	All school years	Opportunistic

Where do we offer vaccines?

- All Barnsley schools including special schools
- Community clinics - advertised by Schools after initial visit and on our Facebook page [@BarnsleySpecialistChildrensHealth](#)
- Home visits

Vaccinations given/refused

- GP reports prepared and sent 24-48 working hours following vaccination.
- SystemOne – no need to duplicate entry
- Other Systems – Please record
- Refusals noted in SystemOne

Barriers

- Covid!
- Vaccine hesitancy
- School access
- Increase in absences/not in school/refusals/behaviour

How can you support us?

- Asking parents who approach you for Flu or teenage vaccinations if they have already submitted consent to the school's team.
- Informing CHIS of any vaccinations given (non-SystemOne practices)
- Share community clinic dates and team contact details

What is CHIS?

The purpose of Child Health Information Service (CHIS), and the systems that support them, is to ensure that each child in England has an accurate active record supporting delivery of public health interventions including; screening and childhood and adolescent immunisations

Scheduling – Refusals and suspensions

- CHIS schedule weekly for all GP Practices in Barnsley
- Patients are scheduled in priority order, primaries first
- Any changes to clinics via email 3 weeks in advance
- Refusal/Suspensions via email after clinical conversation

Waiting List

- Shows patients who are due for the week scheduled or overdue and cannot be appointed due to clinic capacity being full
- CHIS can help to manage via:
 - extra clinics
 - increasing numbers
 - inviting for particular vaccines i.e only pre-school boosters
 - good use of suspension/refusal forms

Hepatitis B – Positive mother pathway

- CHIS contact GP Practice at 2 weeks of age for assurance 4 week dose is ordered and appointment booked
- CHIS send a weekly tracker to Public Health Programme Team, NHSE
- CHIS monitor all doses and follow up any missing on the full pathway

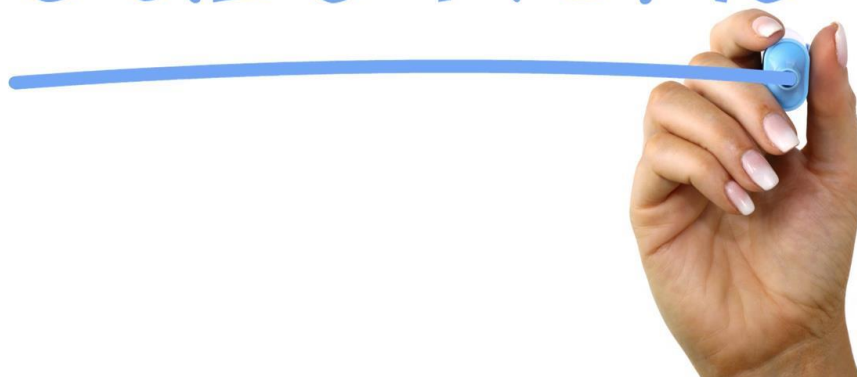
SCID

- Additional test introduced as part of newborn bloodspot test Sept 2021, pilot site Sheffield Screening laboratory along with 5 other labs in England
- SCID results are checked on SystemOne or via a view in EMIS that results are 'not suspected' prior to administering 1st imms – exception of 1 practice where CHIS send electronic notification
- Any babies tested at Leeds are not screened for SCID
- Results may not be available if not recorded by Barnsley CHIS due to sharing agreements, contact us in this instance
