Limitations

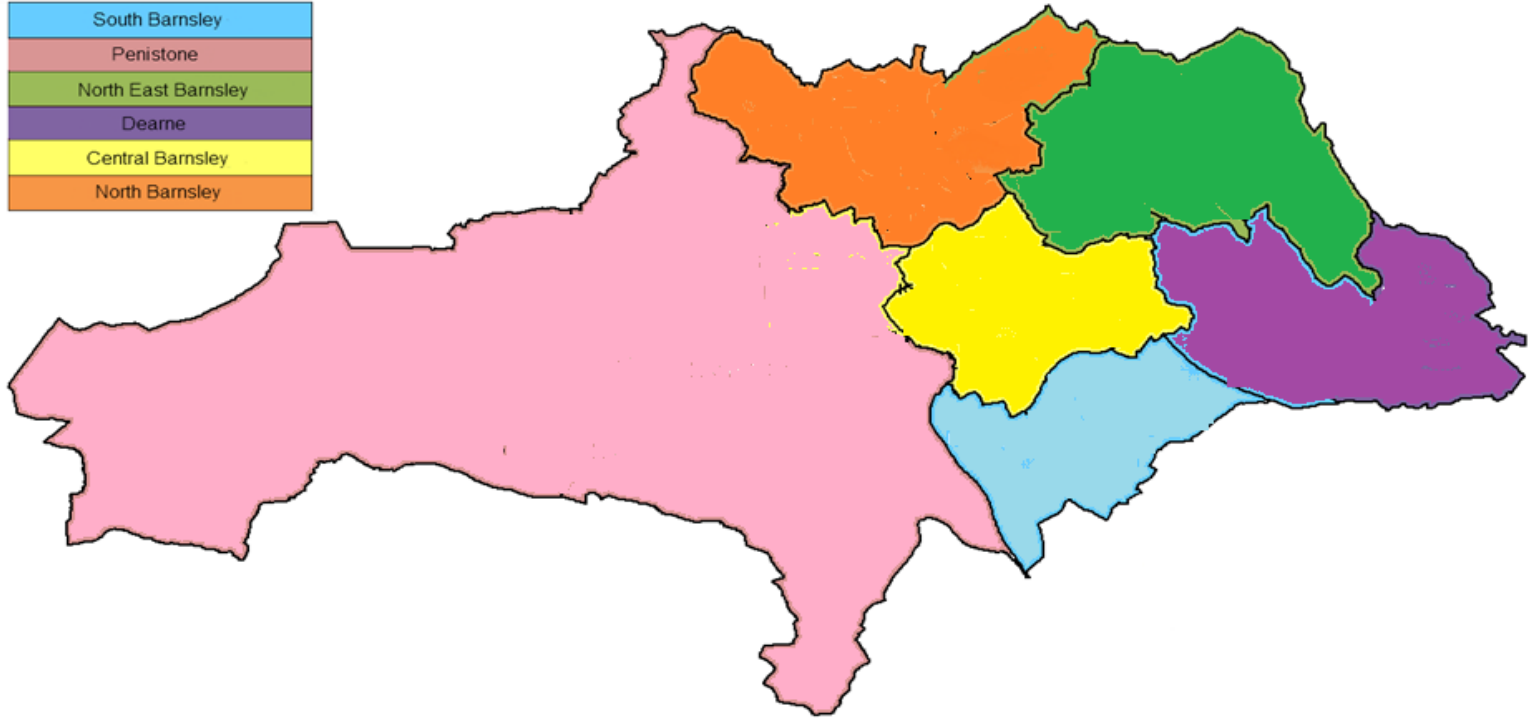
- The primary and community care localities are not fully aligned to the local authority area council geographies. For example in Dodworth and Old Town, the main GP providers are part of the Penistone locality whereas the council wards are part of the Central Barnsley area council. Public health data, for example rates of obesity and smoking, is based on council wards whereas the disease prevalence data (QOF) and hospital episode data (SUS) is based on GP registered lists.

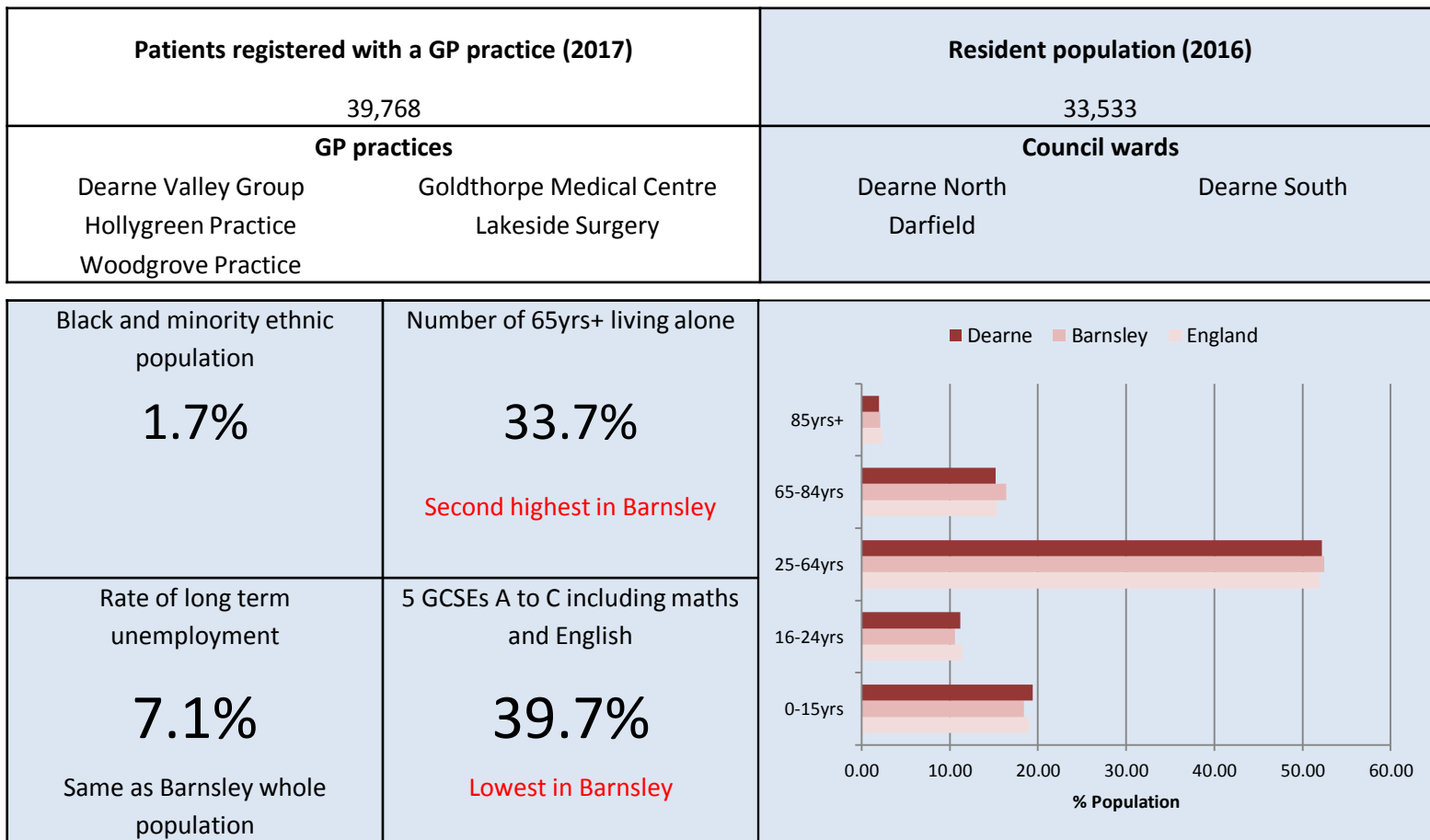

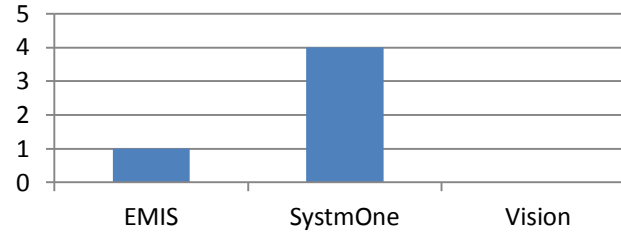

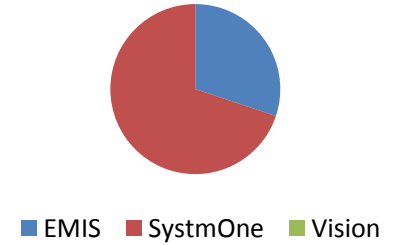

Number of GP practices using different clinical systems

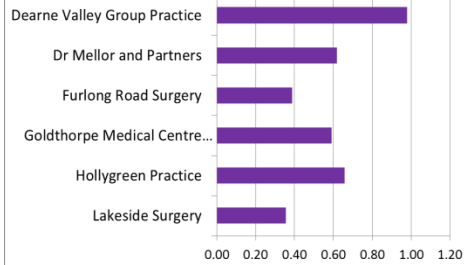


Proportion of patients on different GP systems

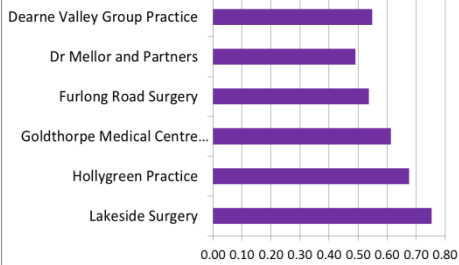

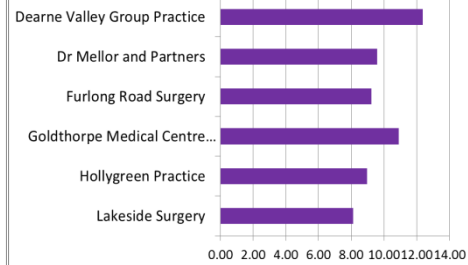
Dementia Prevalence (per cent)



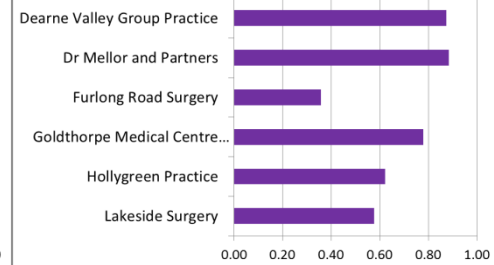
Learning disabilities Prevalence (per cent)



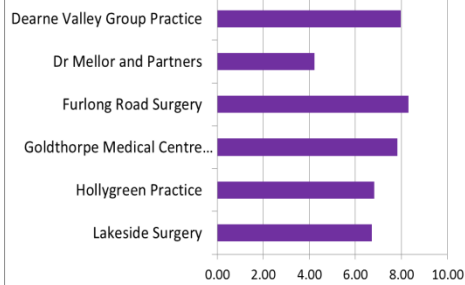
Depression Prevalence (per cent)



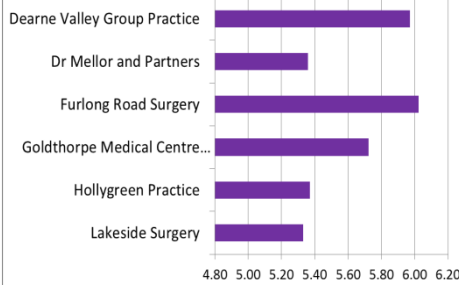
Mental health Prevalence (per cent)



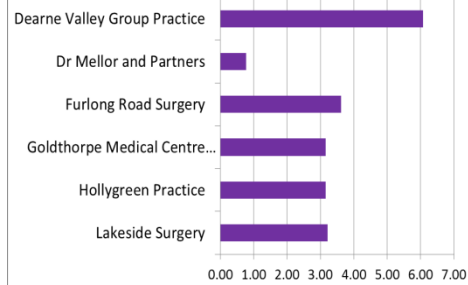
Diabetes Prevalence (per cent)



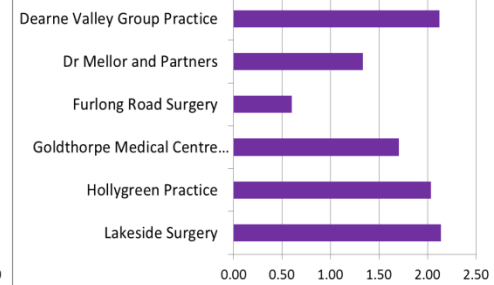
Asthma Prevalence (per cent)



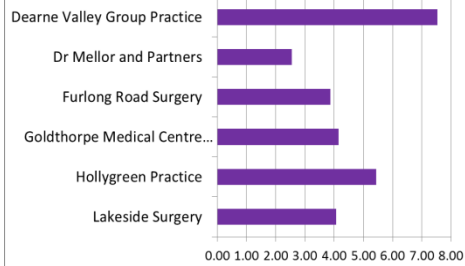
COPD Prevalence (per cent)



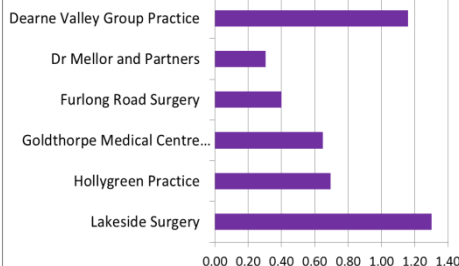
Atrial Fibrillation Prevalence (per cent)



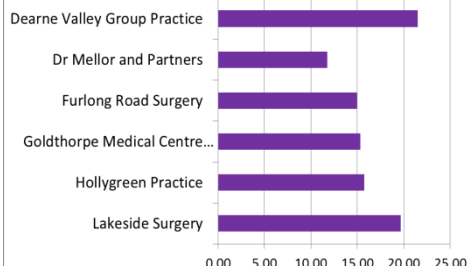
Coronary Heart Disease Prevalence (per cent)



Heart Failure Prevalence (per cent)

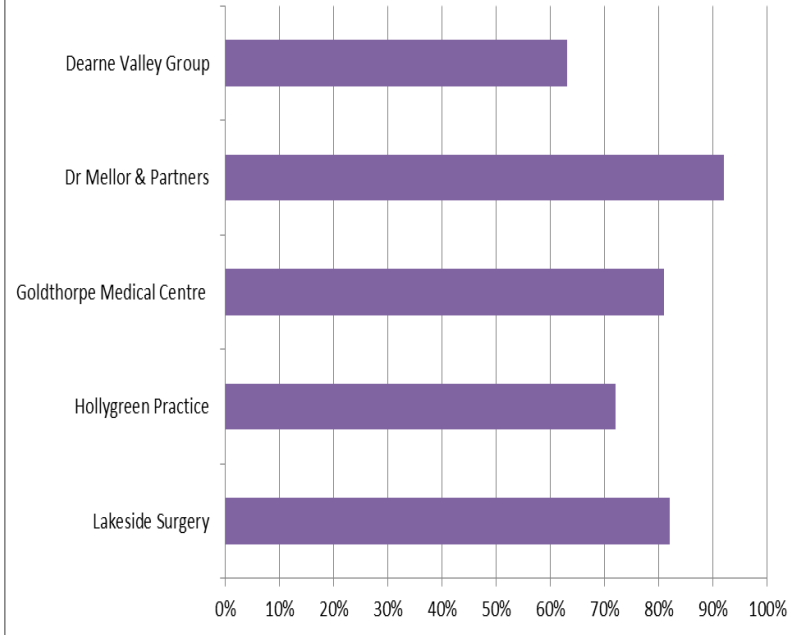


Hypertension Prevalence (per cent)

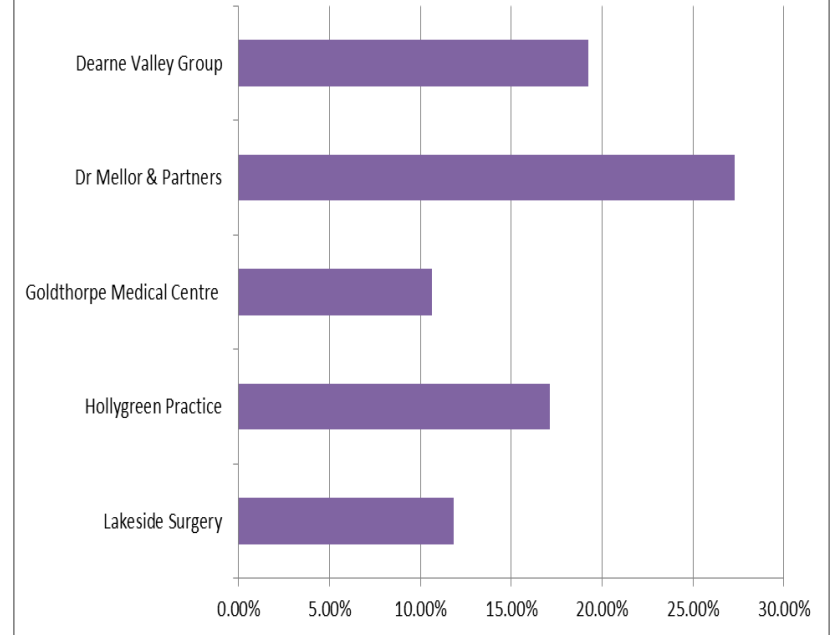

Overall satisfaction with GP

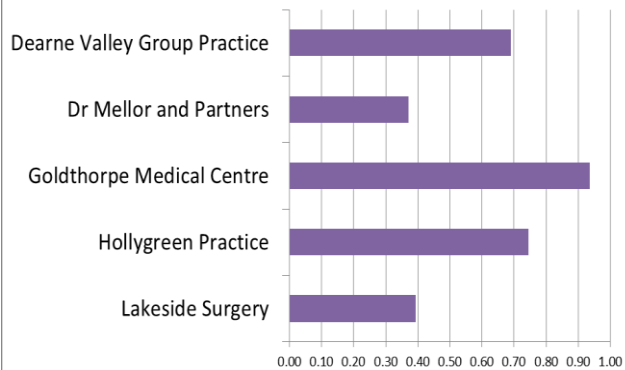


% Patients enabled for one or more GP online services
