
Limitations

• The primary and community care localities are not fully aligned to the local authority area council geographies. For example in Dodworth and Old Town, the main GP providers are part of the Penistone locality whereas the council wards are part of the Central Barnsley area council. Public health data, for example rates of obesity and smoking, is based on council wards whereas the disease prevalence date (QOF) and hospital episode data (SUS) is based on GP registered lists.
