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Prevalence of sight loss in older people

- Almost two million people in the UK are living with sight loss. Approx. 1 in 30. 1 in 5 of people over 75.
- There are more than 11 million people in the UK with some form of hearing loss. Approx. or 1 in 6 of the population. 70% are over 70.
- Approx. 250,000 people in the UK with both hearing loss and sight loss. Of these 220,000 are aged 70 or over.

'In 2011 there were 6860 people living with sight loss in Barnsley. This is set to increase by almost 17% to 7970 by 2020' (RNIB, www.rnib.org.uk/datatool).

N.B The above figure is based on individuals who have registered /have a Certificate of Visual Impairment (CVI). Not everyone chooses to be registered.

What does our team do? Role of Sensory Impairment Services

- Functional assessment in the home environment
- Plan and provide training
- Equipment hearing and visual
- Mobility (e.g. orientation, long cane)
- Daily living skills training
- Communications (e.g. Braille, magnifiers, IT, speech on telephone)
- Eye Clinic Liaison Officer
