## **GLINIDES**

Augment insulin secretion – short acting and may be useful for reducing post-prandial blood sugars. **Little-used and expensive** but have been included in the latest NICE guidance.

Repaglinide  Cost per month (January 2020): 0.5mg – 4mg three times daily £7.99 - £10.82	Both drugs similar in action and, in many respects, their effect is identical to tolbutamide, a much cheaper agent. No trials comparing glinides and tolbutamide.  Rapid onset of action and short duration of activity and should be administered shortly before each main meal.  Licensed for use in type 2 diabetes as monotherapy or in combination with metformin  NICE guidance (NG28):  Be aware that, if metformin is contraindicated or not tolerated, repaglinide is both clinically effective and cost effective for adults with type 2 diabetes. However, discuss with any person for whom repaglinide is being considered, that there is no licensed non-metformin-based combination containing repaglinide that can be offered at first intensification		Educate the person about the risk of hypoglycaemia, particularly if they have renal impairment.  Advice for drivers: See sulfonylureas.
Cost per month (January 2020): 60mg – 180mg three times daily £26.12 - £29.76	Licensed only in combination with metformin.
