

Sayana® Press – Guidance for Primary Care

Sayana® Press is a progesterone only Long Acting Reversible Contraceptive (LARC) injection for subcutaneous administration¹ Sayana® Press is a treatment option when initiating a long-acting reversible progestogen-only injectable for contraceptive purposes in females of child bearing potential (use in adolescent females aged 12-18 subject to clinical discretion).

Sayana® Press is supplied in a single-dose container which contains 104mg medroxyprogesterone acetate in 0.65ml of suspension and is in the form of a pre-filled injector device. It has been designed to allow patients to **self-administer the injection subcutaneously** at home into the anterior thigh or abdomen at intervals of 13 weeks (± 1 week) with an **annual clinical review**.² It reduces the need for patients to attend regular clinic appointments.

The LARC injection Depo-Provera® (Medroxyprogesterone acetate 150mg/ml) also has a green traffic light classification on the Barnsley Joint Formulary. This is injected intramuscularly once every 12 weeks (± 5 days). Depo- Provera® is not suitable for self-administration by the patient.

NICE evidence summary ESNM31 (January 2014) states that Sayana® Press is as effective as Depo - Provera® for preventing pregnancy.¹ Bone mineral density loss and weight gain were similar with both methods of administration.¹

We recommend following these simple guidelines if you or your patient are considering using Sayana® Press and self-administration.

Locally, we recommend that the clinician administers the first injection, whilst demonstrating to the patient how the device works. At the next follow up appointment review the acceptability of Sayana® Press, including tolerance to any presenting side effects. At this follow-up appointment the patient should also self-administer the injection in front of the clinician. If the clinician is confident in the patient's competence, a prescription can be provided. It is suggested that 1 pre-filled disposable injection is prescribed for 13 weeks initially and the patient reviewed again after their first injection at home. Where appropriate 12 months supply (4 pre-filled disposable injections) can then be prescribed.

The Barnsley Area Prescribing Committee recommends that medroxyprogesterone acetate LARC injections are prescribed by brand name to reduce the risk of errors occurring. Sayana® Press and Depo-Provera® are different strength preparations and have different routes of administration.

Advice for Prescribers

Consider

- Is the patient suitable for progesterone contraception?
- Assessing your patient's understanding to recall to administer every 13 weeks
- Assessing competence/ maturity of woman to self-administer
- Appropriateness of using an injecting device
- Patient under 18? consider Bone Mineral Density (BMD). Use of Sayana® Press is only indicated when other contraceptive methods are considered unsuitable or unacceptable.
- Postpartum? If your patient is not breast-feeding, the injection should be given within 5 days

Think

- About contra-indications? (e.g. Sayana® Press is contra-indicated if pregnancy is known or suspected)
- About managing your patients' expectations e.g. return to fertility (up to 1 year), menstrual changes etc.
- Safeguarding home storage of consumables and sharps, especially in young family households
- Re-evaluate use of this method after 2 years

Do

- At the first appointment administer the injection to the patient, whilst demonstrating to the patient how the device works.
- At the second dose follow up appointment, demonstrate again to the patient how the device works and allow the patient to self-administer the injection in front of you. Observe the patient's competence to self-administer.
- If you are happy with the patient's competence to self-administer, a prescription can be provided (it is suggested that 1 pre-filled disposable injection is prescribed for 13 weeks initially and the patient reviewed again after their first injection at home).
- Remind the patient that the bleeding pattern may be a bit different from the intramuscular preparation, bleeding may be heavier.
- Inform the patient that there might be slight skin changes at injection sites.
- Ensure that the patient has access to a purple lidded sharps bin (a prescription can be provided) and are aware of the collection/disposal procedure. See <u>Appendix 2</u> for sharps bins disposal locations.
- Ensure the patient is aware that they need to attend an annual clinical review.
- Remind your patient that contraception does not protect them from STIs and ensure they have access to condoms if needed.
- Provide verbal and written information (NICE CG30:Long-acting reversible contraception).³ This
 information should take into consideration their individual needs and should include: contraceptive
 efficacy, duration of use, risks and possible side effects, non-contraceptive benefits, the procedure for
 initiation and removal /discontinuation and when to seek help while using the method.
- Complete the checklist in <u>Appendix 1</u> as a statement of agreement and understanding.
