


Why smoking cessation?



Service Update

- Service out to tender in Spring 2019, new service in place by end October 2019
- YSF will issue subcontractor contact termination notices in June/July
- Revised website that includes an interactive quit programme, quitter forum and live chat facility
- Opened YSF stall in refurbished Barnsley Market
- YSF link worker for each pharmacy (SCIP)
- Health Harms campaign January 2019
- NRT and Champix voucher schemes are now FREE to clients for up to 12 weeks

What works?

Offering support works



• Advising patients to stop, doesn't

Very brief advice model (AAA) – 30 seconds can save a life

- Ask and record smoking status: smoker/ ex-smoker/ nonsmoker
- Advise patients: 'the best way to quit is with support and medication which are both available on the NHS'
- Act on patient's response: if the patient is interested refer to Yorkshire Smokefree alternatively offer medication alone if client does not want to attend

Smoking Cessation in Practice (SCIP): a systems based approach

- Research has highlighted the importance of ensuring systems are in place to deliver stop smoking support (including VBA).
- The Task Force on Community Preventive Services strongly recommended that provider education should be combined with system improvement (training alone will not improve performance).
