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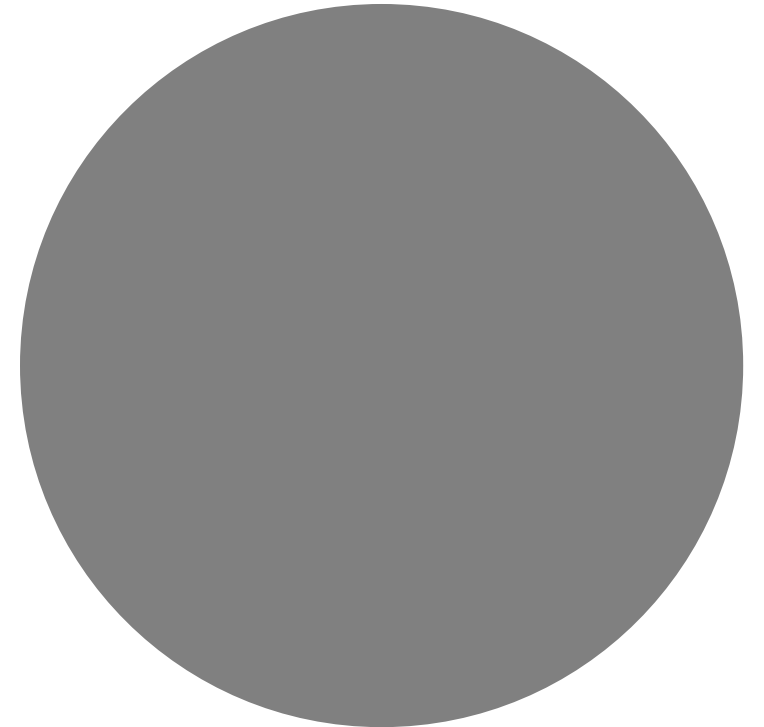
Partnership initiative



To develop and test at a neighbourhood level a new model of working between community health, social care, the voluntary and community sector, primary care and the Acute Trust.

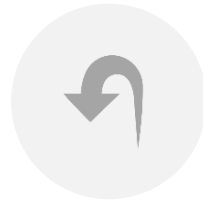

Outcomes (Improving health and wellbeing)	Training for community researchers has led to employment	Set-up a carer's support group for the Dearne Increased local uptake of pulmonary rehabilitation	Better access to iAPT services for Dearne residents Working with Living With and Beyond Cancer to improve the service and access for local residents	Engagement and education events that explain and promote services Views of commissioners with respect to outcomes
